


Linking from EBSCO to ProQuest

Links have been added from EBSCO to ProQuest, whenever full-text is not available in EBSCO. The link appears when only a citation/abstract is available in EBSCO; the link does not appear when EBSCO has full-text of the article.

The user may click on the link to check whether full-text might be available online in ProQuest, before creating an interlibrary loan request for a photocopy. One example where this feature will be appreciated by users, is in the case of *The New York Times*. EBSCO contains only the abstract for this publication, but if the user links over to ProQuest, they will find full-text of the articles retrieved from their initial EBSCO search.

In some cases, the full-text is not available in either EBSCO or ProQuest.
